APPENDIXE

SKILLED AND TRAINED WORKFORCE REQUIREMENTS

- 1. SUBCONTRACTOR represents and warrants that it, and its subcontractors at every tier, has and will have the capacity and ability to, and will, meet the requirements of Education Code section 17407.5 and Chapter 2.9 of the Public Contract Code, including but not limited to sections 2600-2602.
- 2. SUBCONTRACTOR agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold CONTRACTOR harmless from any allegations, claims, judgments, suits, demands, administrative proceedings, fines, and penalties ("Labor Claims"), arising out of or related to SUBCONTRACTOR'S, or any of its agents, representatives, subcontractors, employees, or independent contractors, performance of its obligations under the Agreement and compliance or non-compliance with the skilled labor and workforce requirements, and all related applicable laws. Such defense and indemnity obligation shall be immediate upon tender by CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR shall have the right to be represented by counsel of its choosing, who e fees and costs shall be borne by SUBCONTRACTOR.
- 3. SUBCONTRACTOR'S failure to comply with the requirements of Education Code section 17407.5 and Public Contract Code sections 2600-2602 shall be a default event, entitling CONTRACTOR, in its unilateral discretion, to terminate SUBCONTRACTOR for cause per the procedure and terms set forth in the Agreement at section 17. SUBCONTRACTOR'S defense, indemnity, and hold harmless obligations in this Appendix E and in the Agreement shall survive any termination for cause.

Section 17407.5 of the Education Code reads:

- (a) The governing board of a school district shall not enter into an agreement pursuant to Section 17406 or 17407 with any entity unless the entity provides to the governing board of the school district an enforceable commitment that the entity and its subcontractors at every tier will use a skilled and trained workforce to perform all work on the project or contract that falls within an apprenticeable occupation in the building and construction trades. in accordance with Chapter 2.9 (commencing with Section 2600) of Part I of Division 2 of the Public Contract Code.
- (b) Subdivision (a) shall not apply if any of the following requirements are met:
- (I) The governing board of the school district has entered into a project labor agreement that will bind all contractors and subcontractors performing work on the project or contract to use a skilled and trained workforce and the entity agrees to be bound by that project labor agreement.
- (2) The project or contract is being performed under the extension or renewal of a project labor agreement that was entered into by the school district prior to January 1, 2 0 1 7.

- (3) The entity has entered into a project labor agreement that will bind the entity and all its subcontractors at every tier performing the project or contract to use a skilled and trained workforce.
- (c) For purposes of this section, "project labor agreement" has the same meaning as in paragraph (I) of subdivision (b) of Section 2500 of the Public Contract Code.

Sections 2600-2602 of the Public Contract Code read:

2600

- (a) This chapter applies when a public entity is required by statute or regulation to obtain an enforceable commitment that a bidder, contractor, or other entity will use a skilled and trained workforce to complete a contract or project.
- (b) A public entity may require a bidder, contractor. or other entity to use a skilled and trained workforce to complete a contract or project regardless of whether the public entity is required to do so by a statute or regulation.

2601

For purposes of this chapter:

- (a) "Apprenticeable occupation" means an occupation for which the Chief of the Division of Apprenticeship Standards of the Department of Industrial Relations had approved an apprenticeship program pursuant to Section 3075 of the Labor Code before January I, 2014.
- (b) "Chief" means the Chief of the Division of Apprenticeship Standards of the Department of Industrial Relations.
- (c) "Graduate of an apprenticeship program" means either of the following:
 - (I) An individual that has been issued a certificate of completion under the authority of the California Apprenticeship Council for completing an apprenticeship program approved by the chief pursuant to Section 3075 of the Labor Code.
 - (2) An individual that has completed an apprenticeship program located outside California and approved for federal purposes pursuant to the apprenticeship regulations adopted by the federal Secretary of Labor.
- (d) "Skilled and trained workforce" means a workforce that meets all the following conditions:

- (!) All the workers performing work in an apprenticeable occupation in the building and construction trades are either skilled journeypersons or apprentices registered in an apprenticeship program approved by the chief.
- (2) (A) For work performed on or after January I, 2017, at least 30 percent of the skilled journeypersons employed to perform work on the contract or project by every contractor and each of its subcontractors at every tier are graduates of an apprenticeship program for the applicable occupation. This requirement shall not apply to work performed in the occupation of teamster.
 - (B) For work performed on or after January 1, 2018, at least 40 percent of the skilled journeypersons employed to perform work on the contract or project by every contractor and each of its subcontractors at every tier are graduates of an apprenticeship program for the applicable occupation. This requirement shall not apply to work performed in the following occupations: acoustical installer, bricklayer. carpenter, cement mason, drywall installer or lather, marble mason, finisher, or setter, modular furniture or systems installer, operating engineer. pile driver, plasterer, roofer or waterproofer, stone mason, surveyor, teamster, terrazzo worker or finisher, and tile layer. setter, or finisher.
 - (C) For work performed on or after January I, 2019, at least 50 percent of the skilled journeypersons employed to perform work on the contract or project by every contractor and each of its subcontractors at every tier are graduates of an apprenticeship program for the applicable occupation. This requirement shall not apply to work performed in the following occupations: acoustical installer, bricklayer. carpenter, cement mason, drywall installer or lather, marble mason, finisher, or setter, modular furniture or systems installer, operating engineer, pile driver, plasterer, roofer or waterproofer, stone mason. surveyor, teamster, terrazzo worker or finisher, and tile layer, setter, or finisher.
 - (D) For work pelfonlled on or after January 1, 2020, at least 60 percent of the skilled journeypersons employed to perform work on the contract or project by every contractor and each of its subcontractors at every tier are graduates of an apprenticeship program for the applicable occupation. This requirement shall not apply to work performed in the following occupations: acoustical installer, bricklayer. carpenter. cement mason. drywall installer or lather, marble mason, finisher, or setter, modular furniture or systems installer, operating engineer, pile driver, plasterer, roofer or waterproofer, stone mason. surveyor, teamster, terrazzo worker or finisher, and tile layer, setter, or finisher.
- (3) For an apprenticeable occupation in which no apprenticeship program had been approved by the chief before January I, 1995. up to one-half of the graduation percentage requirements of paragraph (2) may be satisfied by skilled

journeypersons who commenced working in the apprenticeable occupation before the chief's approval of an apprenticeship program for that occupation in the county in which the project is located.

- (4) The apprenticeship graduation percentage requirements of paragraph (2) are satisfied if, in a particular calendar month, either of the following is true:
 - (A) At least the required percentage of the skilled journeypersons employed by the contractor or subcontractor to perform work on the contract or project meet the graduation percentage requirement.
 - (B) For the hours of work performed by skilled journeypersons employed by the contractor or subcontractor on the contract or project, the percentage of hours performed by skilled journeypersons who met the graduation requirement is at least equal to the required graduation percentage.
- (5) The contractor or subcontractor need not meet the apprenticeship graduation requirements of paragraph (2) if, during the calendar month, the contractor or subcontractor employs skilled journeypersons to perform fewer than IO hours of work on the contract or project.
- (6) A subcontractor need not meet the apprenticeship graduation requirements of paragraph (2) if both of the following requirements are met:
 - (A) The subcontractor was not a listed subcontractor under Section 4104 or a substitute for a listed subcontractor.
 - (B) The subcontract does not exceed one-half of l percent of the price of the prime contract.
- (e) "Skilled journeyperson" means a worker who either:
 - (I) Graduated from an apprenticeship program for the applicable occupation that was approved by the chief or located outside California and approved for federal purposes pursuant to the apprenticeship regulations adopted by the federal Secretary of Labor.
 - (2) Has at least as many hours of on-the-job experience in the applicable occupation as would be required to graduate from an apprenticeship program for the applicable occupation that is approved by the chief.

2602

(a) When a contractor, bidder, or other entity is required to provide an enforceable commitment that a skilled and trained workforce will be used to complete a contract or

project, the commitment shall be made in an enforceable agreement with the public entity or other awarding body that provides both of the following:

- (I) The contractor, bidder, or other entity, and its contractors and subcontractors at every tier, will comply with this chapter.
- (2) The contractor, bidder, or other entity will provide to the public entity or other awarding body, on a monthly basis while the project or contract is being performed, a repm1 demonstrating compliance with this chapter.
- (b) If the contractor, bidder, or other entity fails to provide the monthly report required by this section, or provides a report that is incomplete, the public agency or other awarding body shall withhold further payments until a complete report is provided.
- (c) If a monthly report does not demonstrate compliance with this chapter, the public agency or other awarding body shall withhold further payments until the contractor, bidder, or other entity provides a plan to achieve substantial compliance with this chapter, with respect to the relevant apprenticeable occupation, prior to completion of the contract or project.
- (d) A monthly report provided to the public agency or other awarding body shall be a public record under the California Public Records Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 6250) of Division 7 of Title 1 of the Government Code) and shall be open to public inspection.

(End of Code Sections.)
